EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

We are now fast approaching the Christmas season which sadly is the peak time of year for drowning. In an effort to help educate the public, we have held two state wide media campaigns on drowning prevention over the last few weeks. The first was linked to the Keep Watch program, the second linked to Inland Waterways (as inland waterways is the location of the most drownings in Australia). Both campaigns received very good radio coverage on most radio stations in Queensland, we also did news slots on Channel 7, 9 and 10.

Deputy President

I wish to let members know that Mr John McClelland has announced his retirement from the office of Deputy President, which he has held since 2015. Mr McClelland is a life member (appointed 1995) of the society and has been very active over the years. He has held a number of positions on the State Board, over a 15 year period, until 1996. In 1996 John was appointed State President, which he held for 19 years. John is the longest serving President in the Society's history in Queensland. In recent times Mr McClelland was involved in guiding the restructure of the society in 2017.

John will still remain involved in the society, however, has decided to make way for new people to join the board.

With the retirement of Mr McClelland, I wish to announce that Mr Rod Welford has been appointed Deputy President. The role of Deputy President requires a person who displays strong character, presence, and has a history with RLSS, all qualities that Mr Welford displays.

As many members will know, Mr Welford is a life member and has been involved with Royal Life Saving from an early age. He has been actively involved in clubs and sport, but has also been guiding the society in his capacity as a Life Member.

Mr Welford completed a combined Arts-Law degree and was a solicitor of the Supreme Court of Queensland and Barrister of the High Court of Australia. Mr Welford was a long term member of the Queensland Parliament and was Minister of Environment, Heritage and Natural Resources. He became Attorney General and Minister for Justice, followed by Minister for Education, Training and the Arts. Mr Welford's experience and qualifications will be a great assets to our board. I would like to thank Mr Welford for volunteering his time to help us continue our mission of drowning prevention.

During 1892 and 1893, following a number of drowning events across NSW, meetings were held amongst a number of NSW swimming clubs to address the issue. It was unanimously decided at a public meeting to form an Australian Branch of the Life Saving Society of Great Britain on 8 February 1894.

TRAINING REPORT

Trainer's Qualifications

As of 31 March 2019, all competency based trainers and assessors must hold one of the following:

- TAE40116 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment, or
- TAE40110 Certificate IV in Training and Assessment plus the following units:
 - TAELLN411 (or its successor) or TAELLN401A, and
 - TAEASS502 (or its successor) or TAEASS502A or TAEASS502B
- A diploma or higher level qualification in adult education

Trainers can obtain an upgrade, or the additional units through a variety of training providers and we will soon be contacting trainers to ensure they have the required units before 31 March 2019 (if they wish to continue to be a trainer).

RPL / Letters of Support for Trainers completing TAE upgrades

A number of trainers have contacted us seeking a letter of support for an RPL application for the above units. We can only issue letters for trainers for work that we have actually observed which may mean trainers will need to attend our office, deliver courses under supervision or design a training course for us, so we can verify such work.

Lost / Misplaced Workbooks

On occasion we are contacted by trainers who have lost or misplaced assessment workbooks and request that a statement of attainment be issued. Even if workbooks are lost, we are still required to hold evidence that the relevant assessment tasks have been satisfactory completed. We have on occasion be sent statutory declaration, however often these do not meet the required evidence standards.

The process for lost or misplaced workbooks is:

- If the workbook has been lost in a manner that personal information has been compromised, immediately report it to us so we can consider if a data breach report is required.
- Obtain another Assessment Workbook (you may need to purchase one).
- Mark the new Assessment Workbook clearly on the front as 'Replacement Workbook'.
- Complete the Assessment Workbook in the normal manner, have the student sign and date (must be the date signed, but course date will be earlier). Make comments in the book about why a replacement workbook is required.
- Send the completed Assessment Workbook to us with a Examination Report Form.

WH&S eSafe Incident Alert

Workplace Health & Safety Queensland have issued an alert following the drowning of two people in Airlie Beach. The key message in this alert for Royal Life Saving is that adequately training life savers (sufficient on shift and trained by an Industry Body), life savers undertake regular in-service training and management of high risk conduct (diving, running, monitoring children, and use of flotation devices).
